

Special Resolution Paper: Special Resolution to Change the Name of the SCIO (Eczema Outreach Support)

Special Resolution

Members are asked to consider and, if thought fit, approve the following Special Resolution:

That, subject to the consent of the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR), the name of the Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) be changed from "Eczema Outreach Support" to "Eczema Kids".

That the Constitution be amended accordingly.

That the Trustees be authorised to take all necessary steps to implement the change of name, including making the required filings with OSCR and updating the charity's records, policies, agreements, website, branding and communications materials.

Background

The Board of Trustees has undertaken a review of the organisation's name and believes that a change of name will better reflect:

- why Eczema Outreach Support exists: because one child's future lost to eczema is one too many
- its strategic direction and goal to reach children as early as possible in their eczema journey
- the organisation's unique focus on supporting children and young people with eczema, and their families, across the UK.

The proposed new name of "Eczema Kids" will provide a clearer and more effective representation of the charity today and support its future development.

The proposed change relates solely to the charity's name. There will be no change to the charity's purposes, charitable activities or governance arrangements as a result of this resolution.

Regulatory Requirements

A Scottish charity must obtain the consent of the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR) before changing its legal name. The change of name will therefore take effect only once all necessary regulatory requirements have been satisfied.

Recommendation

The Eczema Outreach Support Board of Trustees recommends that members vote in favour of this Special Resolution at the AGM on 15 September 2026.
